SUBJECT: Job 012479, Hwys. 100 & 167 Cable Median Barrier Impvts. (S) Job 012480, Hwy. 412 Cable Median Barrier Impvts. (S) Various Routes, Various Sections Various Counties Tier 1 Categorical Exclusion

The proposed projects would install cable median barriers to highways that have been identified as high priority locations in a recent statewide median crossover study. Tables and project location maps are attached that outline the proposed locations.

The projects would not involve relocations, prime farmlands, wetlands, underground storage tanks, hazardous materials, any environmental justice issues, or cultural resources. These projects have been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source air toxics concerns. The cultural resources clearances are attached.

The official species lists obtained through the US Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation identified the following species as potentially occurring within the project areas: Gray Bat (*Myotis grisescens*), Indiana Bat (*Myotis sodalis*), Northern Long-eared Bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Ozark Big-eared Bat (*Corynorhinus townsendii ingens*), Tricolored Bat (*Perimyotis subflavus*), Eastern Black Rail (*Laterallus jamaicensis ssp. jamaicensis*), Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*), Red Knot (*Calidris canutus rufa*), Red-cockaded Woodpecker (*Picoides borealis*), Alligator Snapping Turtle (*Macrochelys temminckii*), Ozark Cavefish (*Amblyopsis rosae*), Ouachita Fanshell (*Cyprogenia sp. cf. aberti*), Pink Mucket (*Lampsilis abrupta*), Rabbitsfoot (*Theliderma cylindrica*), Winged Mapleleaf (*Quadrula fragosa*), Missouri bladderpod (*Physaria filiformis*), and Monarch Butterfly (*Danaus plexippus*). The official species list is attached. These projects will have "no effect" on the aforementioned species due to the limited scope of the action, lack of suitable habitat, and distance to known species locations.

The Alligator Snapping Turtle is currently a proposed threatened species; the Tricolored Bat is a proposed endangered species, and the Monarch Butterfly is a candidate species; however, the proposed projects would not jeopardize the continued existence of any of these species.

These projects would not have a discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States; therefore, a Section 404 permit will not be required.

After appropriate environmental review, it has been determined that the subject jobs are a Tier 1 Categorical Exclusion as described by the ARDOT/FHWA Programmatic Agreement on Categorical Exclusion Documentation and Processing. A public hearing will not be offered for these projects.





SUBJECT: Cultural Resources Clearance Job 012479 Hwys. 100 & 167 Cable Median Barrier Impvts. (S) Route 100, Section 0 Route 167, Various Sections Various Counties

This job proposes 31.56 miles of cable median barriers on Highways 100 and 167, in Pulaski, Dallas, Cleveland, Grant, and Saline Counties.

A records review included an examination of site files at the Arkansas Archeological Survey's (ARAS) database for previously recorded archeological sites and the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program's (AHPP) database for structures, properties or features eligible for or listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). Map review included the 1819, 1822, 1827, 1845, 1858, and 1865 General Land Office (GLO) plats of Township 2 North, Range 13 West; Township 2 South, Range 12 West; Township 4 South, Range 13 West; Township 5 South, Range 13 West; Township 7 South, Range 13 West; Township 8 South, Range 13 West; Township 9 South, Range 13 West; Township 10 South, Range 13 West; the 1936 Pulaski, Dallas, Cleveland, Grant, and Saline County Highway and Transportation maps; and the 7.5' Pinnacle Mountain (1986), North Little Rock (1986), Spring Lake (1987), Ivan (1985), Fordyce (1985), Sheridan (1984), and Bunn (1984), ARK topographic maps.

The review of the ARAS and the AHPP databases identified four sites (3DA0481, 3CV0047, and 3CV0048- GLO fields with houses and 3DA0659-

historic scatter, destroyed) near the project limits. The 1865 GLO plat shows the GLO fields and houses that were recorded as sites 3DA0481, 3CV0047, and 3CV0048. None of the other resources reviewed indicated any potential cultural resources in or near the project.

The highway infrastructure and known construction practices were examined to assess previous ground disturbance. This type of undertaking will not affect historic properties. All work will take place within the existing ROW, and the limited scope of the project occurs within previously disturbed areas. Therefore, this project requires no Section 106 review under Appendix C, Activity 19, of the 2021 Programmatic Agreement.

This job proposes 17.01 miles of cable median barriers on Highway 412, in Madison and Washington County.

A records review included an examination of site files at the Arkansas Archeological Survey's (ARAS) database for previously recorded archeological sites and the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program's (AHPP) database for structures, properties or features eligible for or listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). Map review included the 1839 General Land Office (GLO) plats of Township 17 North, Range 26 West; Township 17 North, Range 27 West; Township 17 North, Range 28 West; Township 17 North, Range 29 West; the 1843 GLO plat of Township 18 North, Range 28 West; the 1936 Washington and Madison County Highway and Transportation maps; and the 7.5' 1976 Sonora, Spring Valley, Hindsville, and 1973 Hartwell, ARK topographic maps.

The review of the ARAS database identified seven sites (3WA1181- historic wall, destroyed; 3WA1182- prehistoric isolated find, destroyed; 3WA1183- prehistoric scatter, destroyed; 3WA1184- historic scatter, destroyed; 3MA0359- historic scatter; 3MA0372- historic scatter, destroyed; and 3MA0364- prehistoric scatter, destroyed) near the project limits.

The review of the AHPP database identified one historic property (WA0361-Spring Valley School District # 120 Building) listed on the NRHP near the project. While it is within viewshed, it will not be affected. The 1839 GLO plat for Township 17 North, Range 27 West shows a "Road from Osage Prairie to Izard County" roughly following Hwy. 412. None of the other resources reviewed indicated any potential cultural resources in or near the project.

The highway infrastructure and known construction practices were examined to assess previous ground disturbance. This type of undertaking will not affect historic properties. All work will take place within the existing ROW, and the limited scope of the project occurs within previously disturbed areas. Therefore, this project requires no Section 106 review under Appendix C, Activity 19, of the 2021 Programmatic Agreement.

A Biological Assessment is required for construction projects (or other undertakings having similar physical impacts) that are major Federal actions significantly affecting the quality of the human environment as defined in the National Environmental Policy Act (42 U.S.C. 4332(2) (c)). For projects other than major construction activities, the Service suggests that a biological

evaluation similar to a Biological Assessment be prepared to determine whether the project may affect listed or proposed species and/or designated or proposed critical habitat. Recommended contents of a Biological Assessment are described at 50 CFR 402.12.

If a Federal agency determines, based on the Biological Assessment or biological evaluation, that listed species and/or designated critical habitat may be affected by the proposed project, the agency is required to consult with the Service pursuant to 50 CFR 402. In addition, the Service recommends that candidate species, proposed species and proposed critical habitat be addressed within the consultation.
