


\$10,000,000 Overlay Program

Provides Temporary Half-Cent Sales Tax



Proposed Constitutional Amendment Issue 1

- Vote in General Election November 2020
- ¹/₂-Cent Sales Tax Permanent after June 2023
- Continues to Provide \$205 Million to ARDOT Annually
- Continues to Provide \$44 Million to Cities Annually
- Continues to Provide \$44 Million to Counties Annually

AGAINST Funding from current sales tax <u>ends</u> in June 2023




10-Year Renew Arkansas Highways Program

<u>State Highways</u> 2023 - \$740 Million 2024 - \$535 Million



<u>City Streets</u> 2023 - \$150 Million 2024 - \$106 Million

<u>County Roads</u> 2023 - \$150 Million 2024 - \$106 Million

30% Annual Reduction

If Issue 1 Fails



Sebastian County

2023 – \$3.4 Million 2024 – \$2.4 Million

Loss of Funding – \$1,000,000 Per Year

<u>City of Greenwood</u> 2023 – \$0.7 Million 2024 – \$0.5 Million Loss of Funding – \$200,000 Per Year
